<p>Education of Others</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Ethics Consultation (informal and formal), development of and education about policies supporting ethical care, advance directive and POLST facilitation, and support for spiritual cultural practices impacting care. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Clarification of goals of care and palliative choices, support of complementary care modalities, identification of advance directive agents and decisions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Support for advance care planning and surrogate decision making around goals of care, and caregiver support, respite and education. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Facilitation of advance care decision making within institutional processes, supporting culturally congruent care with multiple caregivers and extended lengths of stay. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Support for implementation of goals of care throughout end of live process including interpretation of cultural practices at end of life. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Value clarification and decision making impacting wellness, and planning and implementing community based justice work with health disparities
<p>Spiritual Assessment and Care</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Spiritual Assessment, care plan development and care plan implementation as part of multi-disciplinary care team, response and stabilization in trauma and emergency medicine, staff support in and following crisis and chronic care. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Identification and activation of spiritual resources for resilience & compliance, including mindfulness meditation and grief facilitation as resources in chronic disease management. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Facilitation of family caregiver support and respite, collaboration with faith community based nursing care and other resources for help patient remain in their home. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Grief and bereavement care for both residents, loved ones, and caregivers, emphasizing long term residents' spiritual care needs, proximal grief in residents when death occurs nearby, and cumulative loss support for staff. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Life Review and relational closure with patients, their loved ones and caregivers, support for feelings at end of life, and attention to cumulative loss in hospice team. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Focus: Spiritual Direction, support group facilitation, individual values clarification and holistic wellness mapping, addiction recovery support and short term spiritual assessment and intervention.
