ABOUT PASTORAL FIELD EDUCATION - CHAPLAINCY

The Pastoral Field Education Chaplaincy program is a supervised interfaith healthcare ministry training in Hospice and Hospital Chaplaincy. This hands-on ministry training is under the leadership of the Most Reverend Larry Silva, Bishop of Honolulu; Deacon John Coughlin and Mrs. Kathy Coughlin; and the Office of Deacon Formation. Ms. Hyun Underwood, the PFE Supervisor, provides classroom instruction and direct clinical supervision. The clinical sites are provided by Saint Francis Healthcare System of Hawai`i, Kona Community Hospital, Life Care Center of Hilo, Legacy Rehab and Nursing Home in Hilo, Lāna`i Community Hospital, and Hospice Hawai`i in Lāna`i City. The PFE program is a one-year intense healthcare chaplaincy training providing 48 hours of classroom instruction and 200 hours of hospice and hospital ministry practicum. The PFE education deepens spirituality, interfaith dialogues, and teaches the art and science of spiritual care of the sick and dying.
